"As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him."
Mark 1:16-18

Immediacy is a key theme of the Gospel of Mark, our main Gospel reading for Sundays this year. The word *immediately*, "euthus" in the Greek, appears six times right in the first chapter of Mark and a total of 40 times in the entire Gospel. The word means right now, straight away, without hesitation, making use of the opportune moment to take action. As you read it -- and it's worth reading this short book in one sitting -- there is this sense of urgency regarding the mission of Jesus and his disciples.

That is how I have experienced our life and ministry at Lord of Life this past year -- one thing happening immediately after another. And through it all, I have been impressed with how well you as a congregation have handled the immediate situations we have faced.

Highlights include:

We said goodbye to Interim Associate Pastor John Hirling and welcomed Pastor David, Amanda and Sophia into our fellowship. We handled mold remediation and welcomed several 12-step groups (AA, Al-Anon, etc) who moved from Trinity across the pond as a result of their construction plans. We built a new Welcome Center, fixed the source of a major leak in the narthex, and then along came Hurricane Harvey! Lord of Life staff and leaders mobilized over 1,000 volunteers to muck out houses, feed volunteers with whatever food came in the doors, and develop an Interfaith Clothing and Cleaning Supply Distribution Center here in our building, which was already in a great deal of disarray due to our remediation and construction projects! That help continues still through your generous gifts to the Pastor's Discretionary fund -- close to \$40,000 to date. We celebrated the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.

New changes are on the horizon in 2018: In worship life, look for some changes. Beginning April 23, I will be starting a sabbatical, authorized for Lord of Life pastors every 5 years of ministry. During that time, please offer yourself to volunteer for various areas more readily than you do now -- Pastor David and the rest of the staff will need help to fulfill the ministry needs of this growing congregation while I am away.

Thank you to the Lord of Life Staff, Church Council, and other and leaders of Lord of Life. You have led well in all the immediacies of this past year. May we continue to sense the urgency of proclaiming and acting out, locally and globally, the urgent message at the heart of Jesus' proclamation at the beginning of the Gospel of Mark:
The time is fulfilled, the kingdom of God has come near -- Repent, and believe the good news! Mark 1:15

A Note from Pastor David

All this month we will be continuing our Witness to the Light worship series. I hope you are able to join us and I pray that the stories you hear help you see a few of the ways that God is still active in our world. When I step out of my routine and I pause to look for God, I am often amazed at the little, nearly indistinguishable, ways that God's light manages to break through even the darkest days.

There is a story that we used to tell when Amanda and I were camp counselors. I don't remember where it came from and so I apologize in advance for not giving credit to the appropriate author. But the story went something like this:

There was a woman who was a potter for her entire life. Every day she would sit down at her wheel and mold the clay into beautiful and unique pots. The children in the village would often come and watch her carefully crafting each pot letting the clay glide effortlessly through her hands. When most of the children had gone back to their homes, one little girl stayed behind. She stood silently as though she were transfixed by the spinning of the wheel. After several long, silent moments, the potter looked up and asked her, "What are you thinking about, dear child?"

The young girl didn't look away from the wheel but said in a quiet voice, "You make so many beautiful pots. Each day one is more incredible than the last. But with all these pots you still have a whole wall of old pots filled with cracks that just look ugly. I don't understand. Why don't you throw them away or fix them so that they can be beautiful again?"

The woman stopped the wheel and looked at the girl. Then she got up and walked to the wall of cracked pots. She pulled one off the very top shelf and handed it to the girl. "You say this pot is ugly. But in each crack, I see a



story. There are stories of love and loss, of pain and celebration." The potter then lit a small candle and set it down inside the pot. "And now, these cracks are what the light shine through. I could fix them, I could start over. But I don't want to lose the memories, even the painful ones. And I want the world to see the light through my cracks."

As we step into this new year, I want to encourage all of us not to hide the cracks in our own lives but to allow the light of Christ shine through them into the world.

This is the season of resolutions and new beginnings, so my challenge to each of you is this: do not try to hide your cracks. Do not try to repair them as though they never existed. Instead, share your stories, the places where your life has been cracked, with one another. There may be someone who needs to see the light through the very crack that you want to repair. Let your cracks be a window to the light.

Maybe you don’t feel like you have found your spot in the life and work of Lord Of Life yet. Have heart and keep looking. Take courage and ask around. Many hands make light work. There is plenty to do here and lots of us to share in the doing. And if you look to your left or your right, you just might witness the light of Christ working beside you. *“And though one might prevail against another, two will withstand one. BENJAMIN KESSLER





