**Romans 8, The Message**



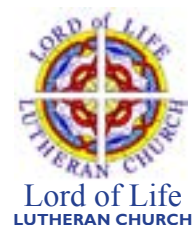

**Construction Update:** After our ground breaking on June 4th, work on the new Welcome Center started on June 5th with the installation of a temporary wall to keep us safe from the work outside and give us building security. Demolition then started on the porch in preparation for the new addition.

After that, the land was cleared and the foundation dirt work started in earnest. The foundation piers were drilled, rebar installed and cemented was poured. The remaining foundation form and rebar was prepared and our new floor has been poured and leveled.



Now wait 10 days for the cement to fully cure so we can start installation of the steel frame for our new Welcome Center. Demolition work has begun for the remodel of the restrooms which will be out of service for about 6 weeks. All work has been performed safely and we remain on schedule for completion by mid October.

As the walls will soon start to go up, we will all have a better feel for how this addition will further our congregations goals and vision - Welcoming One Another!

Thanks to all for their patience and understanding with the disruption to parking and changing entries to the church. It will all be worth it.

**A note from Pastor David**

*Building Community: Invitation*

Last month I shared some important statistics about how often people move in our world. These numbers helped us realize that at Lord of Life we need to be helping equip people to build community wherever they find themselves. With this destination in mind I bring you the first in this multi-part series: **"Building Community."**

Today we are focusing on the first step: *the invitation*.

At its surface invitation seems simple enough but many of us know that it is not always as clear as we would like. It's relatively easy to invite our friends and family to a Labor Day BBQ. This is a low risk opportunity where little will be lost if they say no. We have established a trust and a relationship that makes this a safe invitation to offer. But what about the neighbor that moved into the house two doors down? What about the new face in worship on a Sunday morning? What about the new child in our son or daughter's classroom? Extending an invitation to people in this category can be much more challenging because we don't have a relationship, our fear of rejection or embarrassment is heightened, or we may be breaking a real or imagined social barrier. These factors mean that we are less likely to extend an invitation to this person who is likely looking for an opportunity to build community. So here are a few tips to help us get over the invitation hump:



- 1) Introductions Before Invitations - Sometimes we get excited when we see a new person and we jump over the most important first step. Introduce yourself and, even more importantly, learn about them! Listen when they tell you where they are from and what their family is like and do your best to remember. It makes a huge difference if you can remember their name and their spouse's name the next time you meet.
- 2) Find Common Interests – Just because you really want to go to the special exhibit featuring artwork from the tribes of 3rd Century Scandinavia doesn't mean that this is a shared interest. Through your introductory conversations learn about some things that they are interested in and try to find something that both of you share. The shared interest may be VBS for your children or a local rummage sale for used furniture. This won't always be possible but we are all more likely to say yes to an invitation if we are interested in it.
- 3) Start Small – Starting off with an invitation to a small, onetime, non-threatening event (i.e. cook out, pool party, trip to a park) can be a great way to make a first invitation. It can be intimidating for someone to be invited to an eight-week bible study on the book of Leviticus after you only met them 5 minutes earlier.
- 4) Don't Fear "No" – They may choose to say "no" to your invitation. That's ok! It's not a reflection of you or your invitation. Be gracious and ask if you can keep them in mind for a future event.
- 5) Keep on Praying – We will come back to this step again and again as we build community. When you are preparing to invite them to something, after they have said yes or no, at all times keep this new person in prayer. If you don't know what to pray start with this: "Dear God, I pray for \_\_\_\_\_ during their time of transition. Please help them to find the community they need to be supported in this time and help me see opportunities to share my own community with them. Amen."

**"Our Mission Trip"** by Kylie Guttormson:

"A few weeks ago, 54 adventurous teens and adults decided to travel to Washington state for to work with special needs teens and adults at a day camp. Although each person went with different expectations, we were all shocked by the small, slanted cabins that lacked any sort of heating, and the cryptic hints the warm beach staff gave us about what to expect from our week. Of course, the crash course of our jobs and responsibilities was overwhelming, and we were was unsure and uncertain of our week would look like. We worried a bit during the training, but the night before our campers arrived, everyone learned the name and needs of their camper and our excitement overtook our fears.. The week was full of messy meals, special activities, toothy smiles, loud laughs, and some big tears. This mission trip was the first one where we weren't working with our peers all day long, but this, although intimidating at first, ended up being a reward as we were able to see ourselves, and each other, grow and develop in ways that we didn't think possible. At the beginning of the week, we were encouraged to keep an eye out for our "why," the reason we were on the trip. I went into the week thinking my 'why' was only to leave a positive impact on the campers lives, but I left realizing that the patience and understanding I developed throughout the week would stay with me throughout the rest of my life and how greatly this experience has shaped me as a person."

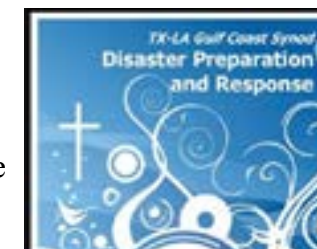
## Red Cross Disaster Response

## TRAVELER to Benefit Fill the Gap

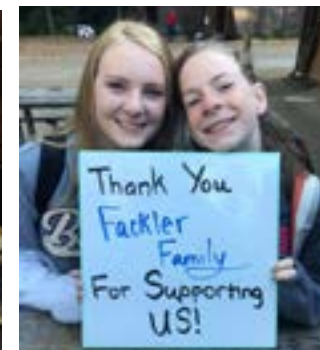

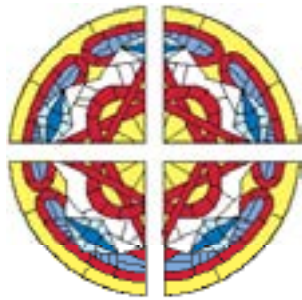
