## **Reformation 500**

This month we have been commemorating events that happened 500 years ago, and how they impacted the world since then. In particular, we are commemorating the 50 most recent years that we Lutherans and our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters have been working toward, putting aside old grudges toward each other, working toward reconciliation in the Body of Christ in order to be better witnesses to the world of Jesus and his love. In the past 50 years, conversations and activities between leaders of the Lutheran and Roman Catholic communities have revealed that we have been, for 500 years, keeping a grudge alive by exaggerating our differences. The very same thing we tend to do in our families, in our politics, and in our congregations.

The highlighting and exaggerating of faults and differences and disagreements - and of hanging on to real and perceived hurts between us- where does it lead? Straight to destruction and death. It leads to massacres like that in Las Vegas. It leads to divorces in marriages. It leads to hostile standoffs and stalemates in government decision-making. And it leads to people in need being hurt and neglected while we waste time in our sinful self-righteousness, hanging on to our need to be "right". If our Reformation history has anything to say to about separation from God, from our neighbor, and from our own selves, it's this from Romans 3:

**For there is no distinction -  
Since all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God,  
We are put right by God's grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,  
whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood ---  
and it's made effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness  
because in his divine forbearance, he has passed over sins previously committed;  
it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous,  
and that he puts right the one who has faith in Jesus.  
So then what becomes of the old boasting? (and grudge holding, we might add?)**

Just this - the more we come to receive the redemption from sin and forgiveness that is in Christ Jesus for all of us sorry sinners, the more we realize how little the things that we have let divide us matter, and the more we desire to be reconciled to one another in the reconciling power of Christ's cross.

In this newsletter, you will find an invitation to participate in an incredible witness to the reconciling power of God in Jesus Christ. Together with Sts. Simon and Jude Catholic Church, we celebrate the ongoing journey of God's re-forming the church,

especially through the reconciliation God is bringing about between Lutherans and Catholics after all these years of "grudge holding". And maybe this commemoration can help us consider letting go of other grudges in our lives as well, so that we can be reconciled and set free to live and love unhindered by divisions and united by the love of Jesus Christ.

See you on our ongoing life and church re-forming journey!

## **A note from Pastor David**

### **Reformation Witness**

As we approach the commemoration of the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther posting his 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenberg sending shockwaves through the Roman Empire and the Church, it is helpful for us to reflect on the important process and task of re-formation. The Reformation may have taken place in the 16th century but the process of re-formation is ongoing because the Holy Spirit continues to be at work in the Church.

In fact, the process of re-formation began long before Martin Luther ever came into existence. We can see evidence of the effects of the Spirit re-forming the Church from the earliest days of scripture. Just take a closer look at the story of Noah:

Genesis 6:19 tells us that Noah will bring two of every kind of animal on to the ark. This is the story we know and love. This is the story we sing songs about and tell our children. But just a few verses later in Genesis 7:2 God says to Noah, “Take seven pairs of all clean animals...and a pair of animals that are not clean.” All of a sudden Noah is taking fourteen of some animals and only two of others. What happened? Did God change plans? Did Noah misunderstand? The people who dedicate their life to understanding this sort of story suggest that this is a sign of changes in the Jewish community. When the stories were being recorded the different numbers reflect different traditions out of which the story came. In other words, as Genesis was being recorded the people doing the recording were already in the process of reforming themselves.

We see evidence of this from Paul’s early letters to his later ones and from one Gospel story to another. In Church history we see how the Church shifted from an underground movement to a political power. We watch as the Orthodox and Roman churches split. Eventually, of course, we get to our favorite Reformer: Martin and his band of merry men (cue the Robin Hood theme song here).

But re-formation didn’t stop there. The church had to be reformed as it came to the United States and as we lost touch with the languages of our homelands. I served a church in Columbus, OH that was called First English Lutheran Church because it was the first Lutheran church in central Ohio to worship in English in 1848. We have reformed to allow women to be ordained and to allow pastors who have gotten divorced to continue to serve. We have reformed the way our pastors dress day to day and even for worship. We have reformed our understanding of the role that non-clergy play in the Church. We have reformed the way we understand our individual congregational roles as we connect to a larger church organization. We have reformed the way we preach and the ways we teach. Even now we are in the midst of great opportunities for re-formation as we deal with a culture that is increasingly ambivalent and even hostile toward faith.

Martin Luther, incredible theologian and pastor that he was, was not the first nor the last reformer of the Church. Each of us has a responsibility to listen to the call of the Holy Spirit and discover the ways that we are being called to be re-formed. And when we see it happening, we must share the story! We may not be called to nail some complaints to a door but through the love of Christ poured out in his death and resurrection we are all re-formers of the Church.

As we celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, our children have been taking a closer look at Martin Luther. Luther was a theology professor in the 1500s, composer, priest and monk who took a stand against injustices in the church at the time. Not only did he nail the 95 Theses to the Wittenburg Castle Church door, but he put the Scriptures in the hands of the people to read. 2 Timothy 3: 16 says "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." Lord of Life put the Scriptures into the hands of five third-graders this month. Now, as parents and congregation members, it is our job to teach, train and help our children learn what the Bible says and how to live it out in their daily lives.

It is the second part of that statement that is the hardest. How do we help our children live out the Gospel? We model and stand up for the injustices, just like Martin Luther, and allow our children to see us doing it. Stand up for what is important to you and your family. Let us raise world-shakers who have an identity in Christ.


